PASTOR'S CORNER

My Dear Family,

The past does not matter nearly as much as the future. In fact, it could be said that the past's entire purpose is to provide lessons for the future. This is why we do not believe in, "Once saved, always saved," a tragically common belief that if we were faithful at some point, even if we lose that faith, that our salvation is still guaranteed. In fact, we do not believe that there is ever a point in our lives when we have guaranteed our salvation until the very moment when we draw our final breath. Our Lord calls out to the sinner constantly, reaching out to him to change his ways and find new life in God's will. If the sinner turning towards God gains him eternal life, it is quite reasonable that a righteous man turning away from God will lose him that same eternal life.
