PASTOR'S CORNER

My Dear Family,

The two disciples on the road to Emmaus are very interesting. They are not of the twelve apostles, but rather followers of Christ who listened to him speak and believed in him. This meant that they were not aware of Christ's promise to rise from the dead; only the Twelve knew about that. We do know that they had been disciples of Jesus for a long time, as the wife of Cleopas is mentioned as being one of the women who attended to Jesus and was there at the crucifixion.

Cleopas is a lot like many of us. We follow Christ, we hear his word, we are his disciples. We may not have particular honors or status in the Church, but we strive to do our best as Christians. And like Cleopas, Jesus walks with us on the way, guiding our lives through his teaching, preserved and passed on through the Church. Listen to those teachings and rule your life by them. For they are Christ's own words, meant to guide us for our whole life.
