PASTOR’S CORNER

My Dear Family,

Two weeks ago, we talked about the need to give thanks for the gifts we receive. In today’s Gospel, we see the pharisee giving thanks to God for his blessings while the tax collector repents of his sins. If giving thanks is a necessary part of our prayer, why then does our Lord say the pharisee was not justified in his prayer while the tax collector was?

The answer lies in the character of these two men. The tax collector is truly humble because he is aware of his shortcomings, while the pharisee is focused on his own goodness. Objectively, the pharisee is doing more for the Lord than the tax collector. He fasts, gives alms, and practices rigorous religion. But he falls into the trap of thinking he is better than others. Pride has poisoned his prayer. May our prayer never be poisoned by our pride. When we approach the Lord, we must always do so fully aware of our whole self. If we are honest with ourselves, we can be honest with God. But a dishonest prayer is the same as no prayer at all.
